What is Waikruu?

The Waikruu ceremony is a ceremony in which students pay respect to their teachers, asking the teachers to accept them as their students.

On the Waikruu day, Thai students bring a candle, three incense-sticks and flowers as a symbol of their respect to their teachers and vow to be obedient and attentive in learning. Teachers acknowledge this respect by accepting flowers, and then ask the students to promise to be good citizens. The teachers then bless the students.

This school year, we continue the objective of the Waikruu ceremony in preserving Thai culture and promoting the awareness of environmental protection. Students grade Kg - 12 will use natural items to do the Thai styles Waikruu flower arrangement (paan-pum) to present to their teachers at the Waikruu assembly on September 22nd at the Fine Arts Center.



Elementary School Assembly
