ISE Songkran



As we move into the month of April, the big celebration in Thailand is Songkran, the traditional Thai New Year's celebration. It is a time for family reunion. People from the rural areas who are working in the city usually return home to celebrate the festival with their family.

The festival starts on April 13 which is called Maha Songkran Day or the day to mark the end of the old year.

April 14 is Wan Nao the day between the ending of the old year and the beginning of the New Year.

The third day of Songkran, April 15, is Wan Thaloeng Sok the day on which the New Year begins.

What do people do?

In Thailand Songkran is a special occasion for a family reunion and merit making. Thai people believe that it is the time to look back and reflect on what they have done through the past year. It is a time to improve themselves, correct their mistakes and strive for a better year.

There are many ceremonies and customs associated with Songkran.

How did ISE celebrate Songkran?

Students, Thai and Non-Thai learned the meaning and history of Songkran separately in their Thai class. Then On April 6 all students went to the Fine Arts Center (FAC) to watch the Songkran presentation, then they did the water homage ceremony to their teachers. Students played Thai traditional games, tried Thai Songkran desert in the Thai class after the water ceremony.

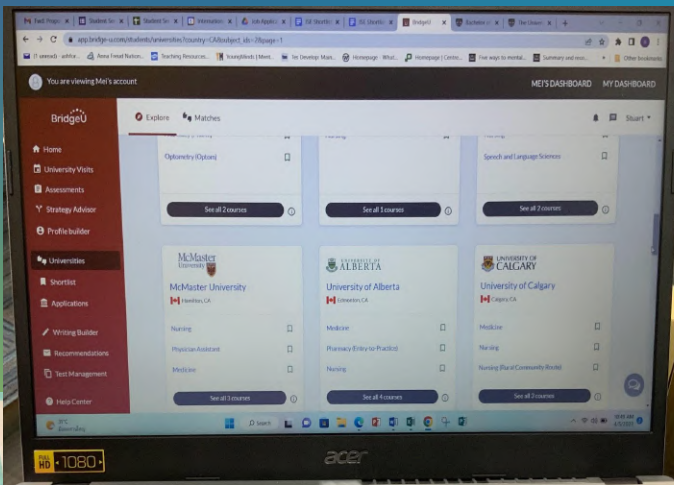


Secondary School IBDP - G10

Grade 11 to Grade 12 Information and Tentative Timeline

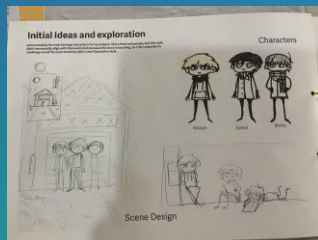
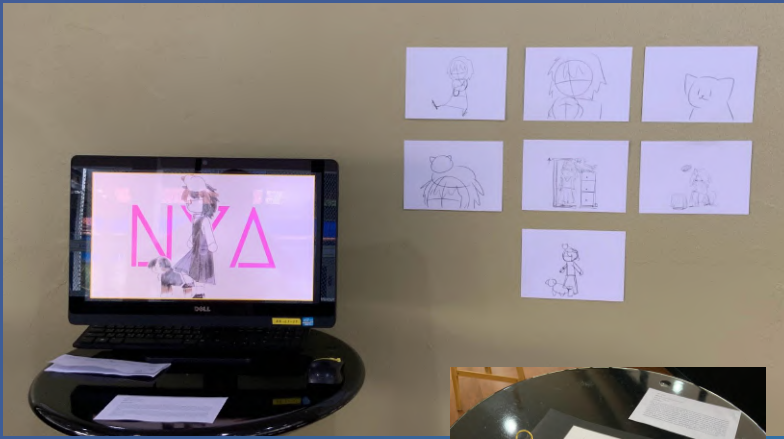


Secondary School Science Club
