The students wanted to learn about the Earth's layers first, so we created a 3D model of Earth by starting from the Inner Core and then adding on the layers of the Outer Core, Matel and the Crust. They cut the 3D model in half to see the different layers.

In the laboratory, the students performed an acid/base titration experiment to gain experience using the equipment and to produce precise results. A titration experiment is used to determine the exact amount of base needed to neutralize an amount of acid.

The Grade 11 IB Chemistry class conducted a calorimetry experiment last week Friday. They burned fuels to determine the energy that those fuels produce. This type of experiment has many industrial uses including determining the efficiency of vehicle fuels to the kilocalories contained in foods.
