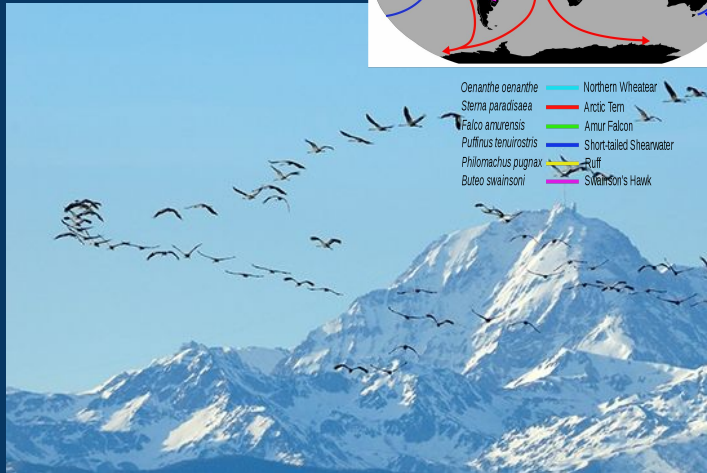
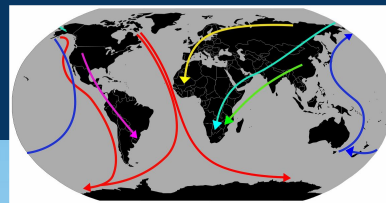
G7 & G8

In Social Studies this week **Grade 6** are studying the migrations of birds, mammals, insects and fish. Here are some of the interesting facts that they have discovered. The Arctic Tern flies from the Arctic to the Antarctic and back again every year – a distance of 30,000 kilometers. The Monarch Butterfly has a four generation migration in which three generations live for six weeks and one generation lives for nine months. The Bar-Headed Goose flies over the Himalayas.

Grade Seven have been studying **Ancient Greece** and are currently looking at some Aesop's Fables. These have been very popular stories for young children through the ages. The main theme of the teaching has been the way Ancient Greece has influenced Western Culture.



Grade 8 have been studying the consequences of overpopulation. Every 12 years the human population of planet Earth increases by 1 billion. The students are looking at some of the consequences: water shortage, food shortage, energy shortage, resource depletion, desertification, land pollution, air pollution, water pollution, deforestation, overfishing, increasing crime, disappearing wildlife, global warming, and many more, I find it very sad that my generation has messed up the world so badly!

Grade 11 is investigating **cell division**. They are looking at slides of onion roots with microscopes. They have taken pictures of what they see through the microscope lenses and are analyzing what percentage of the cells in their field of vision are replicating. This is similar to a technique used by hospital laboratories to determine if tissues from biopsies are cancerous.

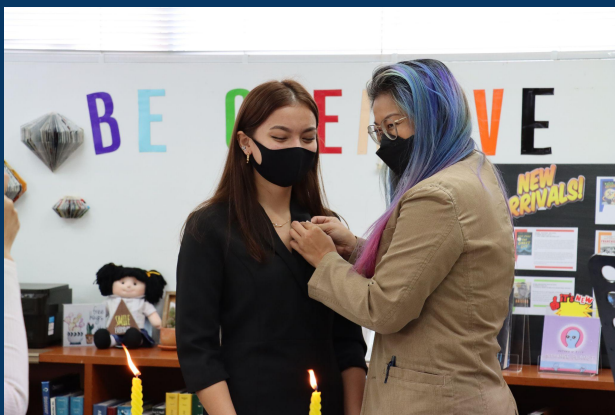
