There will be a special prize for the class that raises the most money!

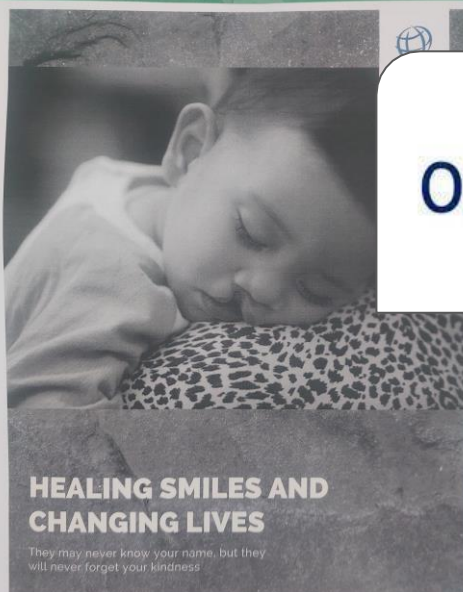

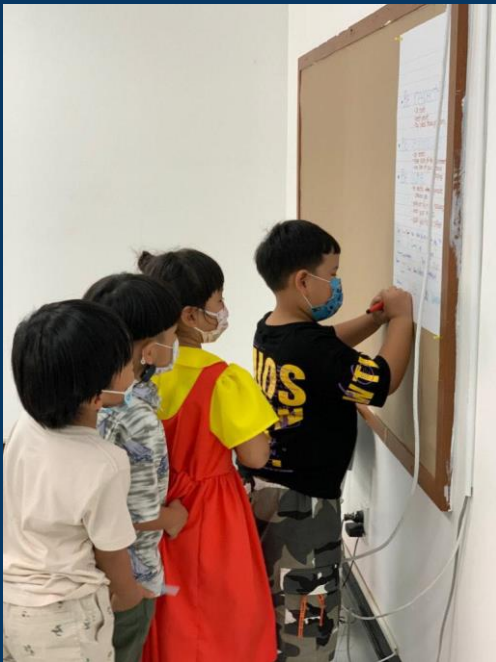




In last Friday's assembly, teachers and students role-played the **ES agreements** that we came up with and these are:

By Louis Sachar

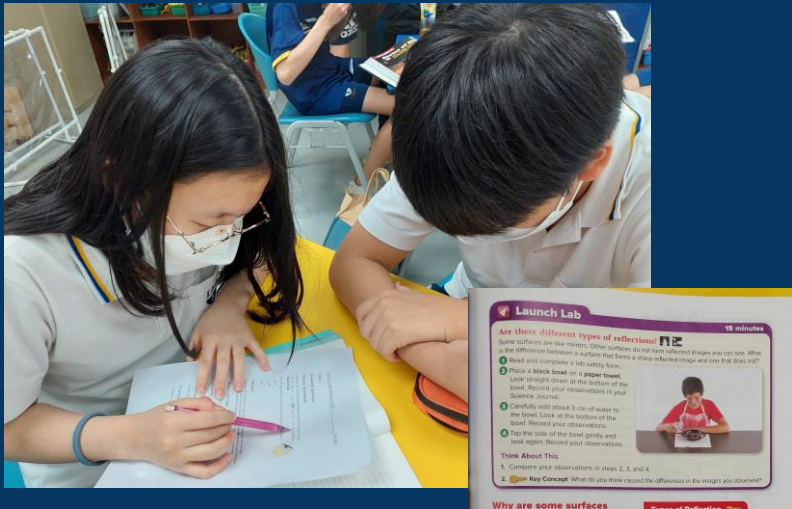

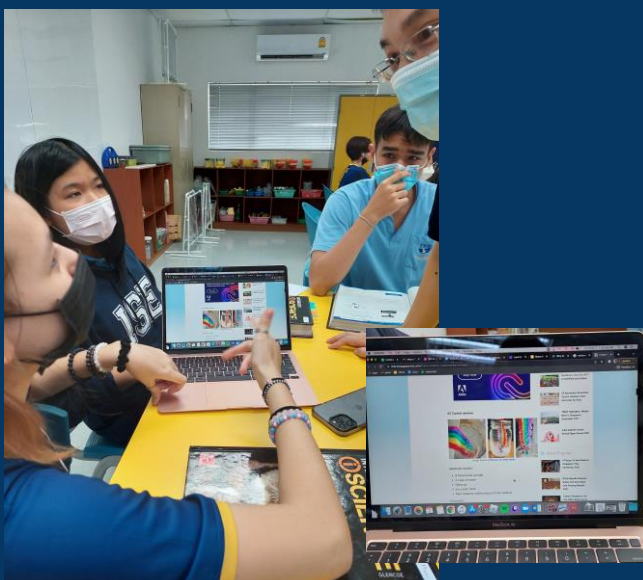

The next UNISMUN conference is in March 2022 and we are hoping to take part again."

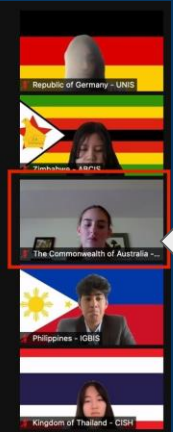
