### Elementary Literacy Week

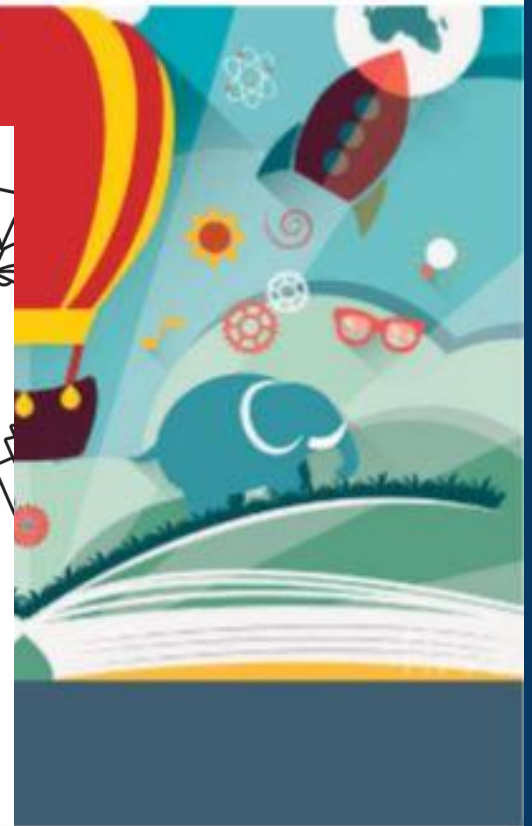
Join us in a book swap where you can swap a book with someone else!



#### Here are the rules:

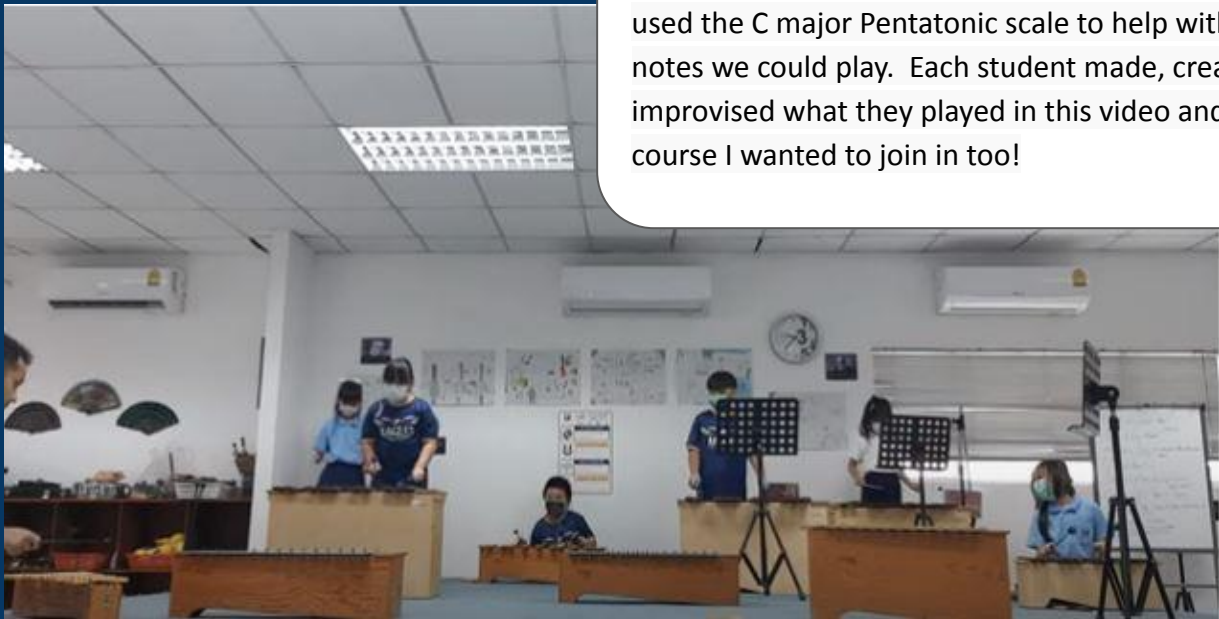
- Bring a book to school during literacy week that you would like to give away

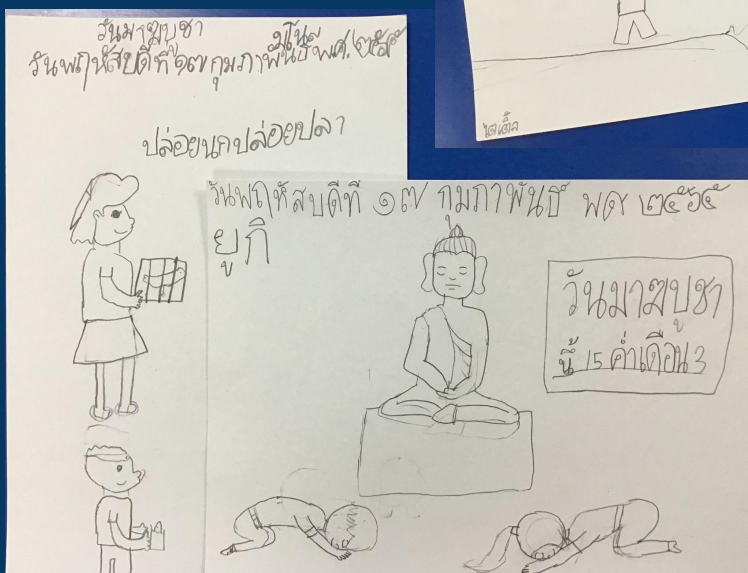




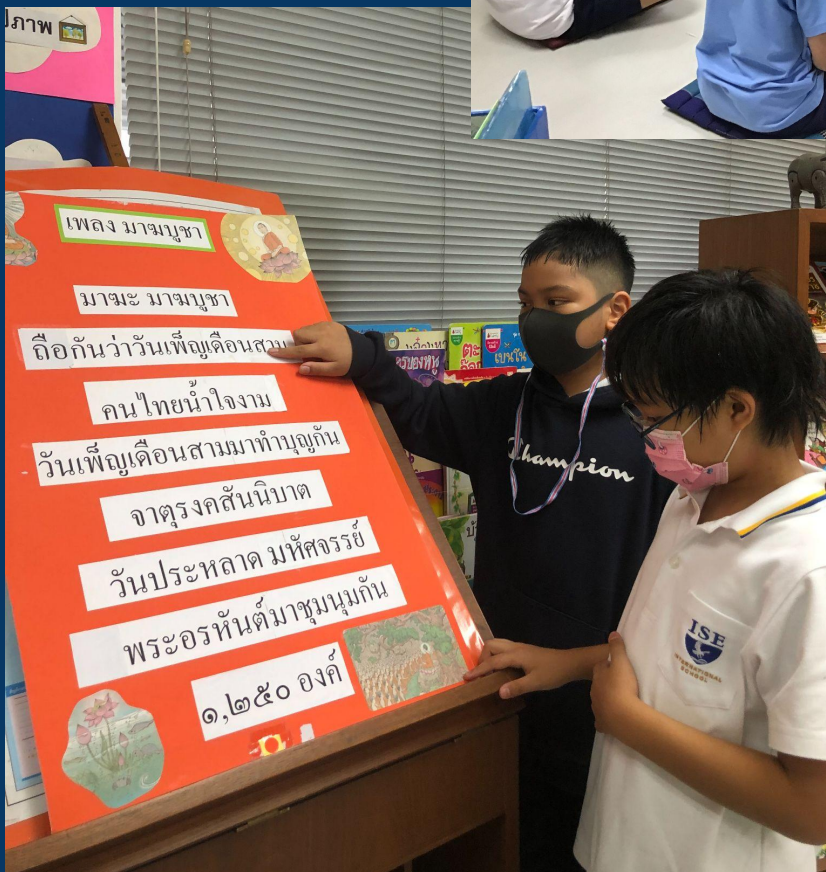


To celebrate the diverse cultures and learn students' own culture at ISE, this week Thai for Thai class students celebrated and learned about Makhabucha day.

Makha Bucha Day, which falls on the full moon day of the third lunar month annually, celebrates Buddha's teachings and commemorates a gathering between the Buddha and 1,250 of his first disciples. The holiday is most celebrated in Thailand, as well as other Southeast Asian countries like Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar.



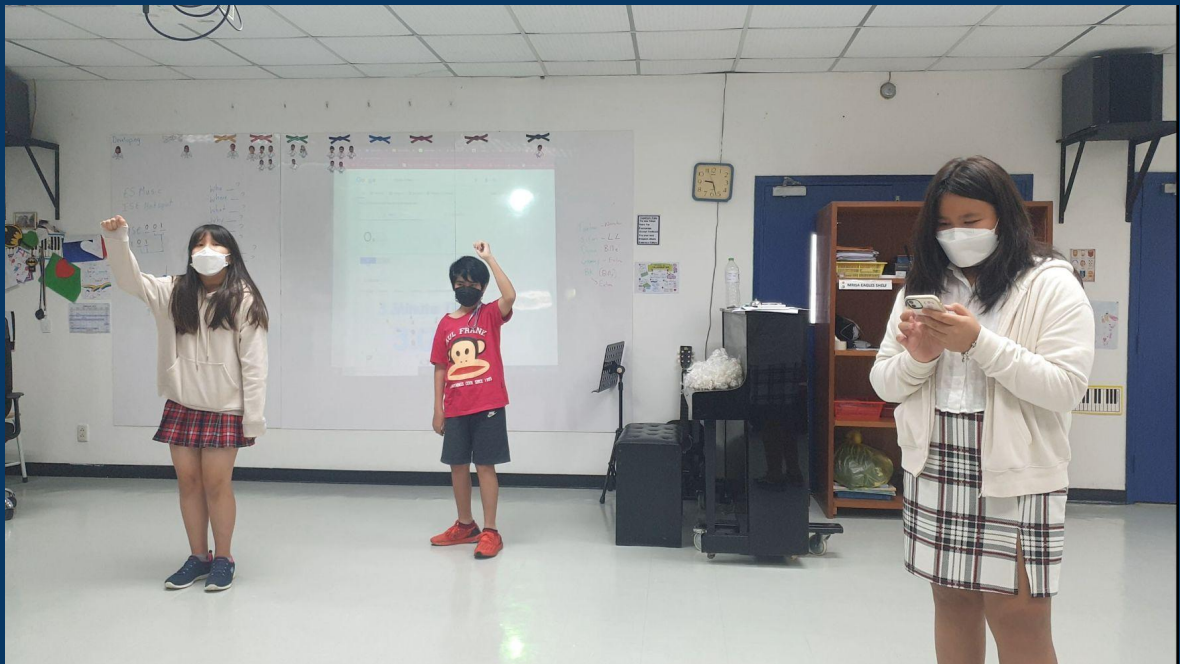




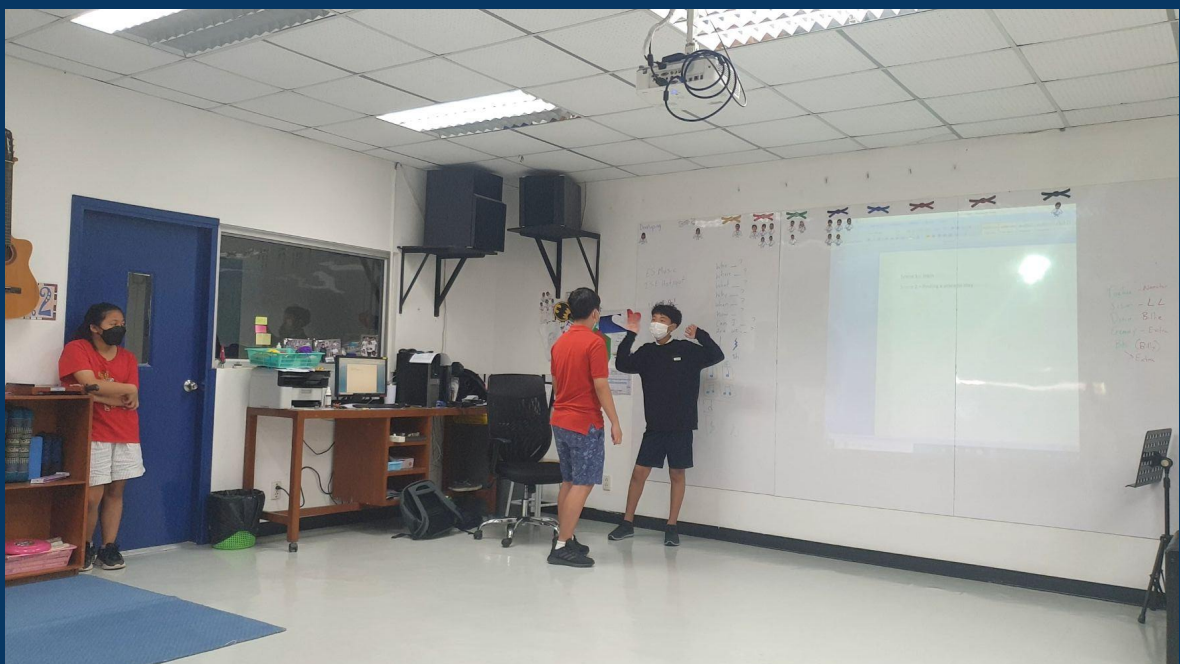
Students learned the history and the meaning of Makha Bucha Day. They practice Buddhist manners and learn how to do formal meditation.



G6

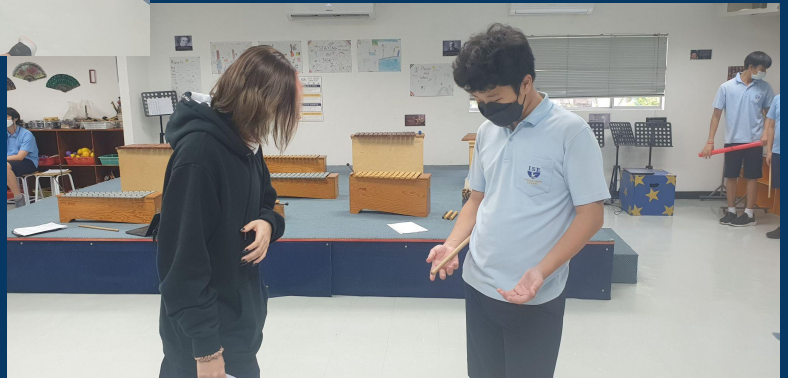
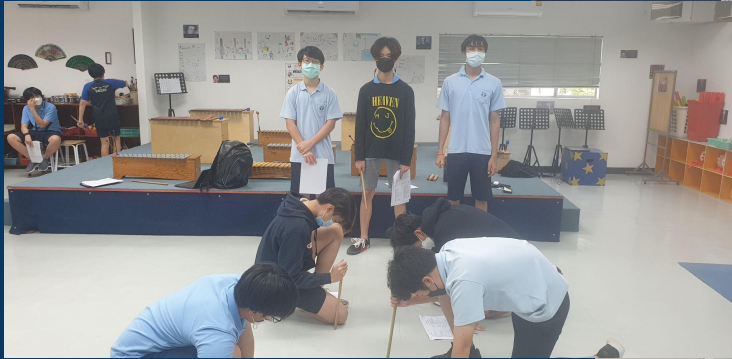

Students in grade 6,7 and 8 rewrote a part of a novel works in a different viewpoint in Korean Class



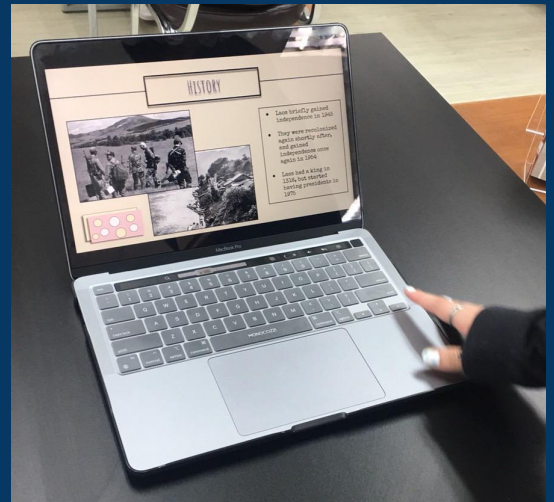
