



Research on campus!

ISE teachers and students alike are busy with research projects on campus.

This summer, Dr. Carter published a peer-reviewed article based on her doctoral dissertation research in the Journal of Research in International Education (JRIE). The research explores international schools within the United States and approaches for promoting international mindedness in these schools.

**Mr. Spiteri** is working on two ongoing research projects. The first focuses on Thailand from a Western perspective in the nineteenth century, examining how gender, class, and race are represented within Western travel narratives of the period. The second project



builds upon his master's (MA) thesis in History and explores The Boy's Own Paper, a Victorian serial publication. This study investigates how the magazine sought to shape boys' identities within and through the frameworks of race, gender, empire, and class.





### Secondary School RESEARCH Dr. CARTER

Ms. Rios' various research projects inform her daily teaching. For example, her research at Catimbau National Park in Brazil examined how leafcutter ants acted as ecosystem engineers, influencing the regeneration of seasonally dry tropical forests—ecosystems that have been increasingly affected by human activities and desertification. Her study investigated how this ant adapted to and even thrived under environmental disturbance, becoming hyperabundant in certain areas of the Caatinga forest. By uncovering the mechanisms that enabled this species to survive and expand in degraded habitats, the research helped identify strategies to mitigate ecological damage, restore ecosystem balance, and raise awareness of the lasting impacts of human activity on fragile tropical environments. Concepts such as habitats, ecology, ecosystem balance, and fragile environments come to life with Ms. Rios' expertise developed during her fieldwork conducted while completing this research.



All of the IBDP students are writing Extended Essays (EEs) on topics of their choice under the direction of a faculty member. The EE is a mandatory research project which culminates in a 4,000 word essay. Current students are focusing their research on a topic of personal interest. For example, Merci Federspiel is investigating the effects of Airbnb expansion on local housing rental prices in Spain. Thanasate "Kongnoon" Nak-rong is exploring the value of women's rights in the novel Kang Lhang Pap (ข้างหลังภาพ). Nico Sakaguchi is writing about Hayao Miyazaki's heroine design which reflects feminine strength and emotional growth through the visual elements such as costume, posture, body language, among others.
