My Experience with the PSAT

On October 8th, I participated in the College Board PSAT/NMSQT exam, which took place in Room 301 with Grades 10 and 11. Although it was my first time taking the PSAT, I found that it wasn't as stressful as people often make it seem on social media. Before the test, I practiced with several past SAT papers to review the types of questions that appear on both the SAT and PSAT. This helped me feel more confident and familiar with the structure. One piece of advice for future test takers—bring a hoodie! The room was a bit cold.



I strongly recommend reviewing past papers before taking the PSAT. Many questions are quite similar, and practice really helps you understand the format. The English sections required careful reading and precise vocabulary choices, while the math sections varied from easy to challenging. The second math module even adjusts in difficulty based on your performance in the first one.

Overall, I learned that preparation truly builds confidence. The PSAT is not something to fear—it's an important step toward success in the real SAT and a great opportunity to understand your strengths and areas to improve.
