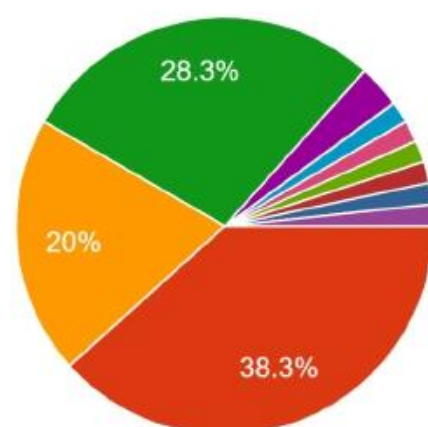
What parents rated the highest:

**2026 Cobra Gold Exercise
Korean Event**



On February 21, 2026, Korean students and their families from our school attended the 2026 Cobra Gold Exercise shipboard reception aboard the ROKS Nojeokbong at Chuk Samet Port, Sattahip Naval Base in Chonburi.

During the event, they had a meaningful opportunity to witness the strong cooperation between the Republic of Korea Navy and Marine Corps and the Royal Thai Armed Forces. It was a proud and memorable experience for our Korean community living in Thailand.





Elementary School SCIENCE G2

In our recent second grade science lesson on Materials and Properties, students participated in an exciting “Recycled City Engineering Challenge.” Working in three collaborative groups, students designed and built their own cities using recycled materials such as toilet paper rolls, egg cartons, paper, tape, markers, and scissors. To begin, they discussed what cities need, such as homes, hospitals, schools, and roads. Also explored what makes buildings strong and stable.

Students learned that the properties of materials, including strength, flexibility, and shape, affect how structures are designed and built. Each group carefully planned by sketching their city and assigning roles, practicing teamwork and shared responsibility. They constructed at least four structures, including one tall building, applying their understanding of balance and stability.

After building, students were given time to improve their structures by strengthening weak areas and adding labels. Using a rubric that was introduced at the beginning of the lesson, students evaluated their work based on planning, teamwork, stability, and creativity. The lesson concluded with group reflections on challenges they encountered and the solutions they developed. This hands-on experience strengthened students' understanding of materials and their properties while building essential skills in engineering design, collaboration, problem-solving, perseverance, and self-assessment.





Secondary School KOREAN LANGUAGE



As part of the Korean Language program, students recently took part in an exciting field trip to a Korean restaurant and grocery store in Pattaya.

During the visit, students practiced basic Korean conversation in real-life situations. They greeted restaurant staff in Korean, read menu items written in Hangul, ordered their meals, and used numbers to read prices at the supermarket. In addition, students participated in interactive “mission challenges,” such as finding Korean food names, identifying taste words, reading price tags, and guessing unfamiliar products by analyzing packaging and images.





Secondary School KOREAN LANGUAGE



At the restaurant, students experienced Korean dining culture firsthand. They observed the variety of side dishes (banchan), practiced describing flavors such as “spicy” and “sweet,” and reflected on cultural differences between Korean and Thai dining traditions, including the practice of sharing dishes.

This hands-on experience allowed students to build confidence using Korean outside the classroom while deepening their understanding of Korean food and culture. It was wonderful to see students actively communicating, exploring, and engaging with the language in authentic settings. We are proud of their enthusiasm and growing confidence as global language learners!
